Bouvet Island DXpedition is On the Air! Bouvet Island DXpedition is On the Air! The 3Y0J team has arrived and begun operations on Bouvet Island. The conditions have been difficult and the team is not yet operating at full capacity.

Where is Bouvet Island ranked?

Bouvet Island is ranked second on Club Log's DXCC Most Wanted List, right behind P5/North Korea. Near real-time updates from the team are being posted to the 3Y0J - The Bouvet island DXpedition Facebook group. Logs will be uploaded from the team as conditions allow. The operators have some access to satellite internet.

Where is Bouvet Island?

Bouvet Island (/ˈbuːveɪ /BOO-vay; Norwegian: Bouvetøya [bʊˈvøːøe]) is an uninhabited subantarctic volcanic island and dependency of Norway. It is a protected nature reserve, and situated in the South Atlantic Ocean at the southern end of the Mid-Atlantic Ridge, it is the world's most remote island.

How long will the DX-pedition team stay on Bouvet Island?

Exact dates TBD. The DX-pedition team will consist of up to 20+ operators with extensive experience in DX-pedition and contesting. The plan is to stay 3 weeks around Bouvet Island, and we will use a large vessel and a helicopter to go to Bouvet.

How do I get to Bouvet Island?

Due to its extreme isolation, the only way to reach Bouvet Island is by boat. There are no airports or harbours on the island, and the nearest harbour is located in Cape Town, South Africa, which is about 1,000 miles away from the coast of Bouvet Island.

How did Bouvet Island become a dependency?

The expedition carried out aerial photography of the island and was the first Antarctic expedition to use aircraft. : 64 The Dependency Act, passed by the Parliament of Norway on 27 February 1930, established Bouvet Island as a Norwegian dependency, along with Peter I Island and Queen Maud Land.
