

Will Ivory Coast get a 52 MW solar plant?

The Ivory Coast government has signed an agreement with infrastructure investor PFO Africa for the financing, construction and operation of a 52 MW solar plant. The project has been billed as the country's largest to date.

How many solar power plants will Ivory Coast have by 2030?

He said Ivory Coast will have added 678 MW from solar power plants projects to its power network by 2030. The state-owned Boundiali Solar Power Plant, located about 660 km (410 miles) north of the commercial capital Abidjan, became operational in June 2023. Authorities hope to extend its capacity to 83 MW from its current 37.5 MW by April 2025.

Will Ivory Coast become a major power supplier in West Africa?

BOUNDIALI, Ivory Coast, April 3 (Reuters) - Ivory Coast officially opened a 37.5 megawatt (MW) solar power plant on Wednesday in what the government said was the first step of a plan to integrate more renewable energy into the power sector. Ivory Coast, the world's top cocoa producer, is seeking to become a major power supplier in West Africa.

When will Ivory Coast's solar power plants be built?

The minister said that contracts are currently under review for the construction of other solar power plants, with a cumulative capacity of 600 MW. Commissioning of these projects will take place in 2025 and 2026. Coulibaly said the Ivory Coast's installed solar capacity currently stands at 2,907 MW.

How much energy does the Ivory Coast have?

It currently has a capacity of 37.5 MW, but Coulibaly says this is set to expand to 80 MW, with financing for the expansion already approved by the Council of Ministers. The Ivory Coast has vowed to reduce its greenhouse gas emissions by 32% and increase the share of renewable energy in its energy mix to more than 40% by 2030.

What is the largest solar project in Africa?

Most recently, under the World Bank Group's Scaling Solar Initiative, IFC is supporting the development of two public-private partnerships to generate 60 MW of solar energy. Today, private operators in Cote d'Ivoire are currently responsible for 70% of energy production and 100% of its distribution.

The 75.6-million-euro (\$82.1-million) cost of building the solar power station was financed by Ivory Coast, a German loan and a European Union grant. "This is the result of the EU's long-standing commitment to the renewable energy sector, with almost 140 million euros since 2017," EU ambassador to Ivory Coast Francesca Di Mauro told AFP.
